2: HAZARD IDENTIFICATION

Physical hazards: Flammable liquids
Health hazards: Serious eye damage/eye irritation (Category 1)
Specific target organ toxicity following single exposure-Respiratory tract irritation (Category 3)

Signal word: Danger
Hazard Statement: Combustible liquid. Causes serious eye damage. May cause respiratory irritation.

Precautionary statement
Prevention: Keep away from heat, hot surfaces, sparks, open flames and other ignition sources. No smoking. Wear protective gloves, protective clothing and eye protection. Avoid breathing mist or vapor. Use only outdoors or in a well-ventilated area.

Response: In case of fire: Use appropriate media to extinguish.

4: FIRST AID MEASURES

Eye contact:	IF IN EYES: Hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15-20 minutes. Remove contact lenses if present, after the first 5 minutes, then, continue rinsing eye. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.
Skin contact:	IF ON SKIN OR CLOTHING: Take off contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.
Inhalation:	IF INHALED: Move person to fresh air. If person is not breathing, call 911 or an ambulance, then give artificial respiration, preferably mouth-to-mouth if possible. Call a poison control center or doctor for further treatment advice.
Ingestion:	IF SWALLOWED: Call a poison control center or doctor immediately for treatment advice. Have person sip a glass of water if able to swallow. DO NOT induce vomiting unless told to do so by a poison control center or doctor. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.
Notes to physician:	Nausea, vomiting. Abdominal pain. Severe eye irritation. Symptoms may include stinging, tearing, redness, swelling, and blurred vision. Permanent eye damage including blindness could result. May cause respiratory irritation. Treat symptomatically.

5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Flammable properties:	Combustible liquid.
Suitable extinguishing media:	Water fog. Foam. Dry chemical powder. Carbon dioxide.
Unsuitable extinguishing media:	Do not use water jet as an extinguisher, as this will spread the fire.
Protective equipment and precautions for firefighters:	Self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing must be worn in case of fire.

6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal precautions:	Keep unnecessary personnel away. Keep people away from and upwind of spill/leak. Eliminate all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks, or flames in immediate area). Wear appropriate protective equipment and clothing during clean-up. Avoid
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	breathing mist or vapor. Do not touch damaged containers or spilled material unless wearing appropriate protective clothing. Ensure adequate ventilation. Local authorities should be advised if significant spillages cannot be contained. For personal protection, see section 8 of the SDS.
Environmental precautions:	Avoid discharge into drains, water courses or onto the ground. Do not discharge into lakes, streams, ponds or public waters.
Methods for containment:	Eliminate all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks, or flames in immediate area). Keep combustibles (wood, paper, oil etc.) away from spilled material. Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Dike the spilled material, where this is possible.
Methods for cleaning up:	Soak up spill with absorbent material (kitty litter, granular clay, soil) and collect into a waste container. Wash spill site with water after material pick-up and dispose with waste. Never return spills to original containers for re-use. For waste disposal, see section 13 of the SDS.

7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

Handling:	<p>Keep away from open flames, hot surfaces and sources of ignition. When using do not smoke.</p> <p>Provide adequate ventilation. Avoid prolonged exposure. Wear appropriate personal protective equipment. Wash thoroughly after handling. Use good industrial hygiene practices in handling this material. When using do not eat or drink.</p> <p>For optimal storage, store product between 5°C and 32°C.</p> <p>During mixing, loading, application, spill clean-up and sprayer clean-up, maintenance or repair, wear a long-sleeved shirt, long pants, socks and shoes and chemical resistant gloves. Avoid contact with eyes, skin and clothing. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Avoid breathing spray mist. Store away from food or feed. Do not contaminate water supplies, wetland areas, or any body of water by direct application, spray drift or when cleaning and rinsing spray equipment or containers. When applied as a tank-mix combination, read and observe all label directions, including rates, personal protective equipment, restrictions and precautions for each product used in the tank-mix. Storage:	Store locked up. Keep away from heat, sparks and open flame. Keep in an area equipped with sprinklers. Keep out of reach of children. Store in a cool, dry and well-ventilated area. Keep in original container tightly closed in a safe place when not in use. Keep away from food, drink and animal feedstuffs.
